

Curriculum vitae

I was born in Belgrade, Republic of Serbia, in 1973. After finishing primary and secondary school, and attending studies I graduated at the University of Belgrade Medical Faculty in 2002.

My first employment was performing duties as physician in military emergency medical service in Belgrade, where I spent three and a half years. During that period I was twice deployed as a member of Serbian Armed Forces in United Nations Mission in the Democratic Republic of Congo, in 2005 and 2007 on a six months rotation periods, working as a member of Air Medical Evacuation Team and also as Deputy Contingent Commander (in 2005) and Contingent Commander (in 2007). In 2016, I was deployed as a member of Serbian Armed Forces in United Nations Mission in Central African Republic, on a six months rotation period, working as primary care physician in Admissions and Triage Ward in UN Level II Hospital in Bangui, and as a Chief and member of Air Medical Evacuation Team. In 2018, I was deployed as a member of Serbian Armed Forces in United Nations Mission in Central African Republic, on a six months rotation period, working as Hospital Commander in UN Level II Hospital in Bangui. In 2020, I was deployed as a member of Serbian Armed Forces in United Nations Mission in Central African Republic, on a twelve months rotation period, working as Hospital Commander in UN Level II+ Hospital in Bangui.

In year 2007 I began residency in psychiatry, at the Military Medical Academy in Belgrade, which I have finished in September 2011. From 2012, I began studying doctoral academic studies, at the University of Kragujevac Medical Faculty. In 2019, I finished substance abuse subspecialization, at the University of Belgrade Medical Faculty. Currently I am working as a psychiatrist at First ward of the Clinic for psychiatry at the Military Medical Academy in Belgrade, and holding the rank of lieutenant colonel of Serbian Armed Forces.

My interests in psychiatry are vast, some of them are: emergency psychiatry, in which field I have considerable experience, then military psychiatry, especially PTSD, and finally psychotic disorders. Also, worth mentioning is my contribution in preparation and training of members of Serbian Armed Forces for involvement in multinational operations, from 2006 first in Peacekeeping Operations Center, and then from 2010 at the Military Medical Academy, as a lecturer, with emphasis on stress coping techniques.
